

The **National School Lunch Program Agreement** is hereby amended in order to carry out the purpose of the after school care snacks provision of the National School lunch Act, as amended:

The School Food Authority hereby agrees that it shall comply with all applicable requirements for the operation of this program imposed by the federal and State governments to include that it shall:

- Limit participation to after school care programs which include education or enrichment activities in organized, supervised and structured settings.
- Administer the program by the district or school, although another organization such as a PTA can operate it.
- Limit participation only for space or security considerations. Programs which include supervised athletic activity (not interscholastic sports) along with education or enrichment activities may participate as long as the athletic activities are open to all.
- Meet the eligibility criteria for: 1) free reimbursement for sites located in areas served by a school in which 50 percent of the enrolled children are eligible for free or reduced price meals, or; 2) claim snacks by category based on the child's eligibility
- Claim snacks which are served in programs which operate after the children's school day has ended.
- Claim only one snack per child per day.
- Claim snacks only for children through age 18. However, if a child turns 19 during the school year, he/she may be claimed for the remainder of the year.
- Serve reimbursable snacks to individuals in after school care programs who are determined to be mentally or physically disabled, regardless of age.
- Charge no more than \$.15 for reduced priced snacks. Provide snacks at no charge to children who qualify for the free rate of reimbursement.
- Serve snacks which meet the meal pattern requirements and consists of two different components in proper portion sizes.
- Maintain the following records:
 - Documentation of site eligibility - all eligible for free or eligible by category.
 - Documentation of individual children's attendance on a daily basis.
 - Documentation of compliance with meal pattern requirements.
 - Snack count by category.

These and all other records, including food cost receipts and invoices, pertaining to the programs will be retained for a period of three years plus the current year and will be made available, upon request, for review and audit by State and/or federal representatives.
